Ensure your Subject Curriculum INTENT is high quality and will stand up to Inspection Scrutiny

This course is designed to support primary school leaders to ensure their curriculum represents the progressive and sequenced knowledge and skills required in each subject area, to ensure that pupils can make good or better progress.

From September the interim arrangements within the grade descriptor relating to INTENT have been removed from the Ofsted handbook grade descriptors. As a result, schools are now expected to have the following in place for all core and foundation subjects:

Extract from the Quality of Education Grade Descriptors:

- 'Leaders adopt or construct a curriculum that is ambitious and designed to give all pupils, particularly disadvantaged pupils and pupils with SEND, the knowledge and cultural capital they need to succeed in life. This is either the national curriculum or a curriculum of comparable breadth and ambition.'
- 'The curriculum may undergo necessary changes (for example, following a review by senior leaders or to take account of COVID-19) and certain aspects may be more developed than others. Where this is the case, these changes do not prevent all pupils having access to an appropriately broad and ambitious curriculum. Where adaptations to curriculum breadth are made for particular pupils, there is a clear rationale for why this is in those pupils' interests, and, where appropriate, there is a clear plan for returning all pupils to studying the full curriculum.'
- 'The school's curriculum is coherently planned and sequenced towards cumulatively sufficient knowledge and skills for future learning and employment.'

School Impact:

By the end of this training session, you will know the strengths and next steps in your subject INTENT area and can make any adjustments, where necessary in relation to:

- Progression and sequencing from EYFS to Year 6 in primary schools and Year 7 to Year 11 in secondary schools
- The degree to which subject specific knowledge is outlined clearly e.g in history this is substantive knowledge (facts), disciplinary knowledge (skills -what it means to be a historian) and chronological knowledge
- The extent to which vocabulary (knowledge) is underpinning the subject curriculum in each year group
- The balance of knowledge and skills are outlined clearly (It is important that the sequence follows the model of knowledge first, then application through skills)
- How subject content (knowledge and skills) are sequenced appropriately so that pupils are building on their prior knowledge and therefore maximising on their learning potential
- How curriculum plans are adapted to meet the needs of SEND and disadvantaged pupils, where appropriate
- How schema links are explicit within curriculum plans
- The degree to which your rationale for the curriculum for your pupils, is coherent and appropriate

What the Best Schools Know and Do

Visible Learning

What works best for learning

Visible Learning means an enhanced role for teachers as they become evaluators of their own teaching. According to John Hattie Visible Learning and Teaching occurs when teachers see learning through the eyes of students and help them become their own teachers.

Professor John Hattie is a researcher in education. His research interests include performance indicators, models of measurement and evaluation of teaching and learning. John Hattie became known to a wider public with his two books Visible Learning and Visible Learning for teachers. Visible Learning is a synthesis of more than 800 meta-studies covering more than 80 million students. According to John Hattie Visible Learning is the result of 15 years of research about what works best for learning in schools. TES once called him "possibly the world's most influential education academic".

Wendy Delf is a leadership and NQT support specialist and an accredited Visible Learning^{plus} trainer with a wealth of experience across various roles in education.

She has worked for over twenty years in the classroom, as an English and Drama teacher, a head of department, a senior leader and an Advanced Skills Teacher.
